- The applicant is requested to provide as much information as possible to document his/her family background, professional and socio-economic status, ownership of land or real estate. This information is **essential** to correctly judge the intention of the applicant to leave the Schengen area before the expiry of his/her visa.
- In some cases, the Consulate may require extra documents from the applicant, also documents that do not feature on this list at all.
- **Certificates issued in Arabic must be translated into English or one of the national languages (FR, NL, DE) and legalized.**
